The K-State family had much to celebrate in fiscal year 2013 with three Big 12 Conference championships, the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl, Kansas State University's 150th anniversary, record enrollment on campus and 17 consecutive years as No. 1 in the Big 12 for the percentage of graduates who are Alumni Association members.

It's a privilege for the Alumni Association to serve as "your link for life" to the university. Your continued support enabled us to achieve many goals last year.



With nearly 118,000 K-State family members and friends participating in more than 1,000 Alumni Association activities in FY2013, we surpassed last year's record for alumni and friends participation by nearly 30 percent. It's our fourth consecutive year of exceeding prior year records for participation.

Our strategic initiatives to enhance the student experience were equally successful. Alumni and friends provided funds that enabled the Association to pay more than \$245,000 in scholarships to K-State students. In its first 10 years, the Alumni Center hosted more than 6,500 scheduled events and more than 500,000 visitors.
